

Dear Potential KVCC Student Athletes and Parents:

The attached pages are being provided to you in compliance with the requirements of the Student Right-to-Know Act.

This Act is intended to provide you with a type of consumer information to help you understand athletic aid and to judge your likelihood of academic success at Kalamazoo Valley Community College.

The first page, 2016 Enrollment Of Students Receiving Athletically Related Student Aid, provides a breakdown of the student athletes who received athletically related financial aid during the 2016/2017 academic year.

The second page, Full-Time, First-Time, Degree Seeking Students Enrolling For The First Time For Fall 2013 Who Graduated By Fall 2016, is more complex. This page looks at a select group of individuals and presents a breakdown of how many received a degree within 150% of the time it “normally” takes to complete a degree (typically three years). Unfortunately, this page was modeled after the typical experiences offered by four-year universities where a student would start on a full-time basis, select a formal program of study at the point of admission, and graduate without transferring to another university. At community colleges, such as KVCC, approximately one-third of students enroll on a full-time basis, many have not decided on a formal program of study at the point of admission, and many successfully transfer to four-year universities prior to meeting the degree requirements of KVCC programs. Nonetheless, our compliance with the Student Right-to-Know Act requires that we prepare and share this page in the prescribed format.

With these ideas in mind, you can see that very few of the 10,000+ students enrolled annually at KVCC fit the criteria for inclusion in this report. On a College-wide basis (the first major column – Total Fall 2013 Students), only 523 men and 517 women were included from the total enrolled in Fall Semester 2013. Many fewer graduated within the prescribed 150% of time: 12.0% of men and 13.7% of women from the Fall 2013 cohort graduated within the 150% time frame. Separating out those students meeting these criteria who also received athletically related financial aid reveals a great deal of variability in graduation rates by sport and gender; from 0% up to 44.4%. The transfer columns show the numbers of students successfully transferring to four-year universities prior to completing KVCC degree requirements. This gives a little more indication of student success at KVCC.
